

METHODOLOGY USED

eduScrum is a tool that supports small or big groups of learners in the process from creating learning goals to high quality outcomes within a certain amount of time. eduScrum uses a learner centred approach fostering values like trust, transparency and democracy. To guide learners through this process, coaching skills are essential.

Coaching in eduScrum empowers learners to take ownership of their learning journey by facilitating their progress, encouraging self-reflection, and fostering collaboration, ultimately promoting deeper understanding and greater achievement of learning objectives. This requires educators to develop key coaching skills, such as effective questioning techniques, active listening, structured conversation guidance, and goal-setting strategies.

Our way of working is highly participative, open, and supports the learning process of each participant and the whole group. We work in an interactive, experiential way in a safe environment. We draw on the richness of the group's experience and focus not only on learning outcomes, but we want everyone to enjoy and take pleasure in learning together and to foster internal motivation for all participants.

FOR WHO?

The invitation to apply to this training course is for active members of organisations who are:

- Directly working with groups of young people on a regular basis: Youth workers, youth leaders, teachers, trainers, coaches and mentors;
- ready to develop their competences in accordance with the topics explained above;
- at least 18 years old;
- able to communicate and learn in English on a sufficient level;
- able and will commit to participate in all phases of the Training Course as shown above
- have support of their organisation or school to innovate their activities with and for youth.

The training is aimed for 20 participants coming from the Czech Republic, Netherlands, North Macedonia and Greece.

PRACTICALITIES

The online phases of the training course will be held via Zoom platform, the residential place will be hosted in Greece and in North Macedonia.

Participation Fee:

All selected participants will be asked to pay a participation fee. This money will be used to cover project expenses that are not included in the grant. It will be paid in advance by bank transfer. Based on financial capacity we ask each participant to support the project with an amount between **20,- and 200,- Euros**, which you will specify when filling in the application form.

IMPORTANT: Finances should not be a barrier to participation in our training, so please get in touch with us in advance if the contribution amount is an obstacle for you to participate.

Travel and Reimbursement of the Travel Costs:

Once you receive confirmation sent by email that you were chosen for participation in the TC from organizers, you can book your travel (economic 2nd class).

Reimbursement of travel costs will ONLY be done upon full attendance in the project and presentation of the original tickets with boarding passes and receipt/invoices. Unauthorized absence from activities and workshops will not be permitted and if happening, may result in the cancellation of travel costs' reimbursements and/or expulsion of the event.
